Individual Speedway Euro Championship Final 1 at Güstrow (Germany)



Individual Speedway Euro Championship was held at Güstrow, in Germany. Polish competitors Krzysztof Kasprzak and Przemyslaw Pawlicki and Slovakian Martin Vaculik were the point scorers from the beginning.

There were some minor crashes from European champion Emil Saifudtinov, Krzysztof Kasprzak and Przemyslaw Pawlicki without any injuries, as well as one tape touching from Italian rider Covatti.

Two riders crossed the inner line with two wheels: Hans Andersen and Nicki Pedersen and they got both a disqualification for this action.

6500 spectators watched a brilliant and close race with lot of overtakings. Most of the times till the last lap it was not clear who would win this heat.

During some track gradings there had were light showers, but during races it always was dry.

Unfortunately after heat 20 heavy rain started: the Last Chance was run, but a few minutes later, the rain was heavy for the final. For safety reasons, the race was stoped after heat 21 and awarded with European championship points after

heat 20. The winner after heat 20 was Martin Vaculik with 12 Points. The runner up was Krzyszof Kasprzak with 11 points and the third position went to the wild card Kai Huckenbeck with 9 points. Janusz Kolodziej was 4th with 9 points as well.
