## Supermono European Cup at Nurburgring (Germany)



The circuit of Nurburgring hosted the Supermono European Cup.

Lukas Wimmer from Austria was again the winner on a warm and sunny Saturday.

The 2015 European Supermono Cup winner took away directly from the start of the race, and was not really threatened by the other riders. He also scored the fastest lap of the race. Behind Lukas the fight was a bit tighter, but with a margin of 3 seconds French David Legalle snatched the second place before Mike Velthuijzen (The





Netherlands) who has returned to the Supermono class again.

On Sunday it was still an excellent weather and a lot of riders on the grid. This race had the same starting grid at the first race. Lukas Wimmer from Austria who won the first race started again from the second place near the poleman Jerry van de Bunt from the Netherlands. But this time Jerry made a good start, and early in the race he gained a gap of 4 seconds on Lukas Wimmer. The gap did not really change during the race and Jerry seized the first win of the season before Lukas. Third place for the Austrian rider Josef Frauenschuh. The next race of the season will be at Zolder, in Belgium on 18-19 June.
